The presenter will be a College Financial Aid Director and the primary focus of the presentation will be the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) and scholarships. Federal Student Aid consists of federal grants, loans, and work study.

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) Help Night, Tuesday, November 15, 4 p.m.-7:30 p.m., Teton High School Computer Lab, Room 202

Three College Financial Aid representatives (including one Spanish speaking) will be available to assist parents in completing the FAFSA application. Parents and students must bring their 2015 Income Tax information to complete the FAFSA. Historically, the FAFSA has not been available to file until January 1; however this year, the application opened on October 1, 2016. It takes approximately 30 minutes to complete the FAFSA. Please feel free

to take advantage of this individualized and free assistance!

General rule of thumb for seniors searching for scholarships:

Check the websites of the schools you are applying to, or call their financial aid office or admissions office, and inquire about scholarships they may have available for incoming freshman. Also, please note the majority of the scholarships in the Teton High School Scholarship Bulletin are outside scholarships, meaning you can use these scholarships at the school of your choice and are not college specific. It is not possible to list all scholarships offered by individual colleges and universities in the Scholarship Bulletin.

They are offering \$4000-\$20,000 scholarships for students that can be used at any accredited U.S. School. Employment is considered when applying. Must have a 3.0 GPA.

The Elks National Foundation Scholarship

\$1,000-\$50,000

The Elks National Foundation will award 500 four-year scholarships to the highest-rated applicants in the 2016 competition.

- Any high school senior who is a citizen of the United States is eligible to apply.
- Applicants need not be related to a member of the Elks.
- Applicants must be citizens of the United States on the date their applications are signed; permanent legal resident status does not qualify.
- Male and female students compete separately.

- Have maintained an unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher from ninth grade to first semester of 12th grade
- Be a U.S. citizen or US Permanent Legal Resident

The demand for a well educated workforce was just one of the driving forces behind the creation of Governor C.L. "Butch" Otter's Opportunity Scholarship. To qualify for the scholarship, a student must meet *all* of the following criteria:

- Have an unweighted, cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above
- Be an Idaho resident
- Be a graduate from an Idaho high school or its equivalent (GED from Idaho)
- Complete the State Board of Education scholarship application by March 1
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) prior to March 1
- Enroll as a full-time undergraduate student seeking their first undergraduate degree at Lewis-Clark State
 College, University of Idaho, Boise State University, Idaho State University, Brigham Young University-Idaho,
 Northwest Nazarene University, or College of Idaho, oR enroll at least three-quarter time at College of
 Western Idaho, College of Southern Idaho, Eastern Idaho Technical College, or North Idaho College

FAFSA

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (known as the FAFSA) is a Federal application that can be prepared annually by current and prospective college students in the United States to determine their eligibility for student financial aid (including the Pell Grant, Federal student loans and Federal Work-Study).

The U.S. Department of Education began accepting applications on October 1. (This is a significant change, as it use to be January 1.)

The first step is to create a FSA ID by going to: https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm

The FAFSA can be filed after October 1, 2016 by going to www.fafsa.ed.gov (You will be using your 2015 income tax information filed in 2016).
