Check the websites of the schools you are applying to, or call their financial aid office or admissions office, and inquire about scholarships they may have available for incoming freshman. Also, please note the majority of the scholarships in the Teton High School Scholarship Bulletin are outside scholarships, meaning you can use these scholarships at the school of your choice and are not college specific. It is not possible to list all scholarships offered by individual colleges and universities in the Scholarship Bulletin.

Michael B Whitfield Scholarship

It is awarded one-time, in the amount of \$1,000.

- Candidates for this scholarship must show an intention to pursue a major course of study in college (or vocational school) in the environmental sciences, biology, ecology, environmental planning or policy, agriculture, or a related field.
- The application is for graduating seniors.
- The awarded scholarship must be used for undergraduate education. The award will be paid directly to the recipient's school of choice.

FAFSA

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (known as the FAFSA) is a Federal application that can be prepared annually by current and prospective college students in the United States to determine their eligibility for student financial aid (including the Pell Grant, Federal student loans and Federal Work-Study).

The U.S. Department of Education began accepting applications on October 1.

The first step is to create a FSA ID by going to: <https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm>

The FAFSA can be filed after October 1, 2018 by going to www.fafsa.ed.gov (You will be using your 2017 income tax information filed in 2018).
