General rule of thumb for seniors searching for scholarships......

Check the websites of the schools you are applying to, or call their financial aid office or admissions office, and inquire about scholarships they may have available for incoming freshman. Also, please note the majority of the scholarships in the Teton High School Scholarship Bulletin are outside scholarships, meaning you can use these scholarships at the school of your choice and are not college specific. It is not possible to list all scholarships offered by individual colleges and universities in the Scholarship Bulletin.

Due in October

Horatio Alger Scholarship

Seniors must be planning to attain a bachelor's degree beginning at a two-year or four-year institution. Students must have a 2.0 GPA, been involved in co-curricular and community service activities, be a US citizen or permanent resident and have a critical financial need (preferably \$55,000 or lower adjusted gross income per family). Students must submit an online application at: http://www.horatioalger.org/scholarship Additionally, students will need to mail one letter of support.

Deadline: October 25, 2016

Coca-Cola Scholarship

Students must apply online http://www.coca-colascholarsfoundation.org/applicants Teton High School CEEB# is 130170 and you will need this on the application. They are offering \$4000-\$20,000 scholarships for students that can be used at any accredited U.S. School. Employment is considered when applying. Must have a 3.0 GPA.

Deadline: October 31, 2016

The Stokes Educational Scholarship Program

Tuition and fees of up to \$30,000 per year at the college of your choice housing and travel entitlements during summer employment (if the distance between NSA and the school exceeds 75 miles)

- Year-round salary
- Employment with NSA after graduation, Health, Life Insurance, federal retirement
- You must be a high school senior at the time of application
- You must plan on majoring in computer science or computer/electrical engineering.
- You must achieve a minimum SAT/College Board score of 1600 (1100 Critical Reading and Math, 500 in Writing), or ACT Score of 25.
- You must have at least a 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- You must demonstrate leadership abilities

With the Stokes Program, you work during the summer at NSA in areas related to your course of study.

In order to be eligible for the Foot Locker Scholar Athletes program, the applicant must:

- Be a current high school senior entering a four-year, accredited US college or university in the Fall of 2017
- Be currently a member (in good standing) of a high school sports team or be involved in after-school sports (e.g. intramurals, martial arts, etc.)
- Have maintained an unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher from ninth grade to first semester of 12th grade
- Be a U.S. citizen or US Permanent Legal Resident

After the first year, CAMP continues academic and personal support throughout college. To qualify a student must be a U.S. citizen or legal resident of the U.S. and demonstrate financial need. You must be accepted into **Boise State University**, or **University of Idaho**. (Some out of state colleges may apply.)

Deadline: Applications are accepted year-round, but priority consideration is **December 31st, 2016.**

Idaho Opportunity Scholarship

The demand for a well educated workforce was just one of the driving forces behind the creation of Governor C.L. "Butch" Otter's Opportunity Scholarship. To qualify for the scholarship, a student must meet *all* of the following criteria:

- Have an unweighted, cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above
- Be an Idaho resident
- Be a graduate from an Idaho high school or its equivalent (GED from Idaho)
- Complete the State Board of Education scholarship application by March 1
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) prior to March 1
- Enroll as a full-time undergraduate student seeking their first undergraduate degree at Lewis-Clark State College,
 University of Idaho, Boise State University, Idaho State University, Brigham Young University-Idaho, Northwest
 Nazarene University, or College of Idaho, oR enroll at least three-quarter time at College of Western Idaho,
 College of Southern Idaho, Eastern Idaho Technical College, or North Idaho College

FAFSA

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (known as the FAFSA) is a form that can be prepared annually by current and prospective college students in the United States to determine their eligibility for student financial aid (including the Pell Grant, Federal student loans and Federal Work-Study).

The U.S. Department of Education began accepting applications on October 1. (This is a significant change as it use to be January 1.)

You first need to create your FSA ID. To create your FSA ID go to: https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm
The FAFSA can be filed after October 1, 2016 by going to www.fafsa.ed.gov (You will be using your 2015 income tax information filed in 2016)
