What is a levy?

A levy is a property tax to help fund D401 schools. Needs like salaries, staffing, and programs are funded through the levy. Using the levy for these purposes allows school districts to provide for ongoing needs and maintain the quality of the educational environment for students.

Why?

The state of Idaho underfunds education. 82% of districts in Idaho run supplemental levies. Renewing this levy will allow the district to continue the following:

- Keep important programs in our schools:
 - Full-day Kindergarten program

- This levy is 25% of the district general budget.

What will it cost the taxpayer?

For 2017, \$100,000 taxable property: \$191.48/year, or \$15.96/month

(For 2015, \$100,000 taxable property: \$231.47/ year, or \$19.29/month)

Why the decrease of \$39.99/year for the same amount of levy?

The payment is a fixed amount divided into the total market value of property in Teton County, so as the market value increases, the tax burden decreases on a fixed amount like a levy.
