2 Implement Dual-Immersion Program

- English-speaking students and Spanish-speaking students will learn in both their native and targeted language throughout their school day.
- The program will begin 2017-18 in Kindergarten and 1st grade on a limited basis through parental registration.
- The scope of the program will grow annually from K-12th grade.

What will this mean? Students participating in this program will develop bilingualism/biliteracy, academic achievement, and cross-cultural competencies.
