General rule of thumb for seniors searching for scholarships.....

Check the websites of the schools you are applying to, or call their financial aid office or admissions office, and inquire about scholarships they may have available for incoming freshmen. Also, please note the majority of the scholarships in the Teton High School Scholarship Bulletin are outside scholarships, meaning you can use these scholarships at the school of your choice and are not college specific. It is not possible to list all scholarships offered by individual colleges and universities in the Scholarship Bulletin.

Idaho Farm Bureau Scholarship

This scholarship is available to members of Idaho Farm Bureau. If your parents have an insurance policy through Idaho Farm Bureau, then you qualify. You can hand the applications to me by March 3rd, or drop them off at the Driggs Office.

Microsoft Disability Scholarship

Eight (8) \$20,000 scholarships distributed over 4 years (\$5,000 per year, renewable). Awards are renewable for up to three years or until a bachelor's degree is earned, whichever occurs first, on the basis of satisfactory academic performance maintaining a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale, full-time or half-time enrollment, and continued enrollment in the eligible major.

- Be a current high school senior living with a disability as defined by WHO, including visual, hearing, mobility, cognitive, and/or speech disabilities or other disability
- Plan to enroll in an undergraduate program at an accredited 2 or 4-year University/College or Vocational/Technical School, in the United States, in the fall of the upcoming academic year.
- Pursue a degree in the following eligible majors: engineering, computer science, computer information systems, law, business, or a related field (e.g. paralegal, pre-law, finance, business administration, or marketing).
- Demonstrate a passion for technology.
- Demonstrate leadership at school and/or in the community.
- Have a high school cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 grading scale or equivalent.
- Require financial assistance to attend college.
- Enrollment status must be full-time or half-time.

Idaho Career Technical Education Foundation, Inc.

Three Idaho CTE Scholarships each have a deadline of March 14th.

- **Tools for the Trade Student Scholarship**

The Tools of the Trade \$1,000 scholarship was established to provide funding for Idaho students pursuing certificates or degrees in career and technical education programs at Idaho technical colleges. The intent of this scholarship is to offset the costs of purchasing required equipment/tools/software as determined by the specific program selected by the student. Any student who plans to enroll in an approved career and technical education program at the postsecondary level that requires occupational tools/equipment/software is eligible for this scholarship.

- **Neptune Lynch IX First-Year Postsecondary Scholarship**

The \$2,500 Neptune Lynch IX First Year Postsecondary Scholarship was established to encourage Idaho students pursuing their first-year towards a certificate or degree in career technical education at one of Idaho's technical colleges. This competitive scholarship is available to students who plan to enroll in an approved Idaho Career Technical Education program at the postsecondary level.

rootEd Undergraduate Scholarship

The rootEd Undergraduate Scholarship is a renewable scholarship awarded to graduates of eligible high schools in Missouri and Idaho. It is a need-based award of up to \$12,000 per academic year and is renewable through graduation or a maximum of 10 semesters, provided the student continues to meet eligibility and selection criteria. All fields of study, except the ministry and divinity degrees, are eligible for funding.

To be eligible to be considered for this scholarship you must:

- Be a graduating high school senior, from an eligible high school, planning to enter college as an incoming freshman in the 2025-2026 academic year.
- Plan to enroll in a bachelor's degree-granting program at an accredited, nonprofit college or university
- Have earned a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average while in high school
- Demonstrate financial need, as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or similar need calculations. Students with a Student Aid Index (SAI) over \$15,000 must have significant and extenuating circumstances to be considered.
- All fields of study, except the ministry and divinity degrees, are eligible for funding.

It is the applicant's responsibility to make sure that ALL required documents have been submitted by the deadline.

The Scholarship Foundation may not be able to notify the applicant of missing documents prior to the deadline.

FAFSA

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (known as the FAFSA) is a form that can be prepared annually by current and prospective college students in the United States to determine their eligibility for student financial aid (including the Pell Grant, Federal student loans and Federal Work-Study).

The U.S. Department of Education will begin accepting applications in December.

You first create your FSA ID for you and a parent. To create your FSA ID go to:
